

Interpretation of Diploma Supplement and Transcript Information for Taught Modular Programmes

The University's programmes of study are organised according to a modular structure. Each module is a self-contained unit of teaching, learning and assessment which is assigned a credit value according to the number of notional study hours assigned to it. One credit point is assigned for 10 notional study hours. Modules are assigned a level which maps to the Framework of Higher Education Qualifications in England, Wales and Northern Ireland as follows:

Each module has learning outcomes which are appropriate to the designated level of study. Modules are specified for a programme of study at validation. Information about programme structure can be found in the relevant programme specification which can be accessed through the Study Here - Programme Specifications link from the University website. Students will typically study 120 credits in one year as a full time undergraduate student or 180 credits in a year as a full time postgraduate student. A part-time student will study the same number of credits for an award at a slower rate. Credit may be transferred to the University from another UK or international HEI. On selected exchange programmes equivalent marks on the University scale are assigned for work undertaken according to agreed mark translation tables and incorporated into award calculations. For information on the actual performance at another HEI, that institution's transcript should be consulted.

All modules are marked according to a standardised 0 - 100 marking scale. The minimum pass mark for an undergraduate module (Levels 0, 1, 2 and 3) is 40. The pass mark for a module at Level M is 50. A maximum pass mark of 40 is available on re-examination for an undergraduate module. A maximum mark of 50 is available for re-examination for a postgraduate module. The degree classification for an honours degree is determined by consideration of the average mark derived from the credit-weighted average of all marks at levels 2 and 3. Other awards may be graded with merit or distinction, again determined by reference to the credit weighted average of module marks.

The University's degrees are awarded by York St John University, or the University of Leeds, or the University of York as indicated on the individual student information overleaf. The language of instruction for all awards is English. Awards typically qualify students for study at the next H.E. level, eg a Bachelors degree will qualify a student for study at Masters level or a Foundation degree will qualify a student for study at Bachelor Honours level.

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
